#### Introduction

## **Emergencies**

An emergency is defined as something which is immediately causing danger to a person's health or safety, or is causing serious damage or destruction to property.

If you encounter a fire get everybody out of the property immediately, shut the doors and call 999. Call 999 also for a medical emergency or criminal damage.

If you smell gas, open all doors and windows, turn off all appliances and call the National Gas Emergency Service on 0800 111 999. If you have a burst or leaking pipe turn the water off at the stopcock and call us immediately. For our up to date out of hours contact details please call our landline and listen to the message.

## **Electrical Safety**

You must ensure that your electrical items are used correctly. Electrical safety is very important and is your responsibility. Please use the following guidance for maintaining a safe environment:

- Do not overload your plug sockets
- Turn off appliances when not in use
- Keep appliances from overheating
- Keep all electrical items away from water
- Report any electronic malfunctions immediately
- Keep your appliances clean and free of dust
- Keep electronical items out of reach of children

### Controlling Condensation

You can help to prevent condensation (which can lead to damp) in your home by following these guidelines:

Open doors regularly to let the air circulate

Keep bedrooms ventilated, particularly at night

Always use your extractor fans

Open windows whilst cooking

Do not block or cover up air vents

Dry laundry outdoors as much as possible

Ensure tumble driers are ventilated to the outside.

## Fire Hazards and Precautions

It is your responsibility to keep your property free of fire hazards. Below are some fire safety tips to help you to keep your home free from hazards:

- Keep hallways and door-entrances free of any clutter
- Do not leave cooking unattended and keep young children out of area
- Take care to check your smoke alarm regularly
- Invest in a fire blanket

#### Safety and Security

You have a responsibility to keep your home secure. If you are going out, always lock front and back doors, and ensure all windows are closed. Security alarms should be activated if applicable.

If you wish to decorate or make improvements to your home you will need to contact us to obtain written permission from the landlord.
